### Butlins Bognor Regis

Customer: Bourne leisure.

#### Services Provided:

- Disabled persons to safely be evacuated from the Buildings within the complex in the event of an emergency
- Onsite training and delivery
- Ongoing support & maintenance



#### Background

The Holiday Camp opened on the 2nd July 1960 after Billy Butlin reached an agreement with the town council, to move from his fairground site near the town centre to a 60 acre site at the eastern end of the Esplanade, at a cost of £2.5 million the site was soon receiving 3,000 weekly campers.

Over the years many things have changed at Bognor, and under new owners Bourne Leisure planned for the new millennium, and in 2005 the Shoreline Hotel opened and in 2009 the Ocean Hotel.

#### Objectives

- The objective was to implement a number of evacuation Chairs within the Complex
- Provide easy operation for staff to enable disabled persons to be evacuated in event of an emergency
- Provide a comfortable solution for customers to go down stairs in a safe and dignified Manner
- Offer regular maintenance and training programs

#### Solution

The Solution was to implement the Evacuation Chairs. The CD7 Evacuation Chairs were fully supplied by Baronmead which included an ongoing service and training contract, delivery.
